Do you have ancestors buried at the **Lone Pine Cemetery In Whitman County Washington**?? It is approximately 3 miles from Tekoa which is south of Spokane. A group of people that are interested in cleaning up the cemetery have formed a non-profit organization and governed by a board. Our goal for last year was to clean up the debris which was created by people attempting to clean the brush, weeds, lilac bushes, etc. That goal has been accomplished. We have received many generous money donations toward the other needs of the cemetery, which are many. Many of the headstones have toppled over and the cleaning of the headstones is badly needed. We would like to have a path through the cemetery, which there is none now. The earliest date of birth on a stone is 1809 and the earliest date of death on a stone is 1883. No burials were permitted since 1953.
